Demonstrator: Michael Gibson

Biography: In his early years growing up in England, Michael worked on wooden sailing yachts along the banks of the River Crouch. He moved to the US in the eighties and began a career as a finish carpenter and later a home builder. Working with wood all of his life, Michael was always interested in woodturning and studied for many years to perfect his craft. What began as a hobby blossomed into a passion. He is mainly known for his teapots.

Michael was a featured demonstrator at the American Association of Woodturners International Symposium in 2013 and received high honors as recipients of the “Award of Excellence” for one of his pieces. In the last AAW Symposium in Pittsburg he received The Masters Choice for his piece in the Merging Exhibition. He has demonstrated for numerous chapters of the AAW and has been feature demonstrators in several States symposiums, as well as teaching and demonstrating in Canada, Norway, Turkey, England and New Zealand and throughout the United States. michaelgibsonwoodturner.com

Ramblings from the President

Bob Black, President 2015

Shift gears, change focus; we are now aiming at one of our highlights of the year, the Christmas Party. There will be dinner and a good time, of course, but we also have three activities that are important to the operation of Chattahoochee Woodturners. The three activities are the ornament exchange, the raffle and the auction.

Just in case you didn't get a chance to read my deathless prose in this space last month I'm pretty much going to repeat what I said. You will get a letter at the November meeting next Tuesday with the details of the party and 10 raffle tickets. The letter will outline the cost of the raffle tickets if you wish to buy them and I hope you do, the cost of next year's dues, \$25, and the cost of the dinner, expected to be \$10 per person as it has been for several years. If you should happen to miss the November meeting the information will come to you via snail mail. A gentle reminder, Uncle Sugar charges almost half a buck for delivering a letter. So, strike a blow for frugality, attend the meeting, and save CWT the cost of mailing it to you.

You then send Ryan McDonald a check at 8930 Creekstone Place, Gainesville, GA 30506 to reserve your place at the party. The deadline for registration is Monday, November 30, 2015. We have to have a number of people to give to the caterer by that date.

What would really make it easy for all the folks planning the event, namely: Ken Spruill, Ron Norris, Jerry and LaFern Chandler, and Ryan McDonald, is just bring a check to the meeting next Tuesday night and pay then.

In the mean time you need to have those lathes smoking. I'm tremendously pleased with your response to our Marketplace effort to produce nearly 400 items for the booth. Now is the time to turn that effort toward turning ornaments for the exchange and any turned items for the raffle/auction.

Turn two Christmas Ornaments for the exchange, one for you and one for your spouse. We encourage you to bring a spouse but it is not mandatory. Friends, acquaintances or neighbors are all welcomed and especially someone who wants to start a collection of turned art.

The ornaments are for the ornament exchange. Bringing an ornament for the exchange is also not mandatory, but encouraged. The ornaments are turned in as you arrive and are all displayed on a table so everyone can see them. They get a number. That way the drawing is blind until you get an ornament and then the names are revealed. You don't get your choice at the display table. This means you don't have to worry about your ornament being the last chosen. Fair enough?

There is one display for raffle items and another for auction items. Auction items are usually turned pieces, but each year the Cookie Lady, otherwise known as LaFern Chandler, gets top dollar for her baked goods, usually a really tall cake. A good guideline for what to bring for an auction item is bring what you would like to get. In case you are new to Chattahoochee we have some nationally known turners in our group so be prepared to see some really nice stuff.

On a more serious note, the dues we pay cover about two thirds of the cost of demonstrations. On top of that we have rent on the building, maintenance, equipment purchase and this year \$500 for our Eagle Ranch outreach program. How do we keep this ball in the air with no visible means of support? The Christmas Auction and Raffle supplies the magic. This means all hands really need to turn to and build, no not ships, but turned items. Then show up. Then bid early and often.

Even if you don't bid, you will have a grand time. How so. Jerry Chandler is our auctioneer. The auction is like standup comedy show. Come see if you don't agree.

The really important part is SHOW UP. You can't join in the fun if you are not there.

The Marketplace show is November 5-7th. That is the weekend just before our November meeting. I urge you all to attend the show. The Eagle Ranch/Chattahoochee booth will be manned by at least one CWT person and an ER person. Come see what you have done. I'm very proud of the effort by the CWT members and I think you will be impressed when you see the booth and can see all of what you have done in one place. Nearly 400 items – that is a lot. The cost to get in is \$5 and the money goes to the benefit of Safe Kids of Gainesville/Hall County as does the nearly \$1000 Eagle Ranch is paying for the booth. 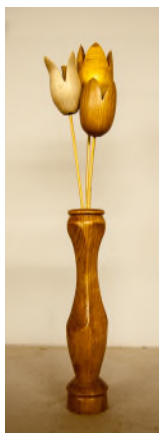
