If you attended our Christmas Party in December, you saw some beautiful Christmas ornaments exchanged among our members. The ornament that I brought and which was received by Don Griffiths if I remember correctly was based on a Don Russell design. It was constructed with a segmented globe with a turned icicle and cap. There were a number of questions about how it was made, so Frank and I asked Don Russell to come and give us a demo on making them. Don does a lot of segmented work and has perfected this design of a segmented ornament. Don is an excellent demonstrator and his demo this month should be of interest to all.
