We had 24 folks attending as Jerry Chandler gave an entertaining presentation to inspire us to try turning simple ornaments. One was an icicle turned using a wooden Morse Taper. One of his points was that dark ornaments do not display well on a tree as it gets lost. He made a platform to fit in the banjo to hold a Dremel tool in a V block to make flutes. He also demonstrated the ease of making a home made index wheel of tempered Masonite. One detail you can add to a finial is to use chatterwork on the endgrain parts of a finial bead. □

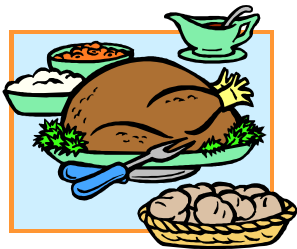
