Ramblings from the President

Mike Peace, President 2013

I enjoyed Rudy Lopez's demonstration last month. He left us his demo piece and a nice bowl he turned during his workshop for our Christmas auction. Leon Thomas was unable to demonstrate this month as planned so I will be demonstrating "Adding Pizzazz with Threads." I just did two rotations at Southern States Woodturning Symposium so have had some practice with this demonstration. Attendance was down this year from last but it was a successful symposium. I saw Jerry Chandler, Wes Jones, Michael and Cynthia Gibson, Joy and John Moss and Harry Cardwell.

Let me tell you about a training experience. I had been turning about a year and had what I thought was a fair grasp of the essentials. I could sharpen my tools and could generally get them to do what I wanted them to do. I had a variety of projects under my belt and generally did not worry about catches, although they cropped up from time to time. I had received but a little hands-on instruction, but I had seen a few club demos. I had watched an all-day demo by Stuart Batty (Ashley Harwood's mentor) when he demonstrated his "push cut". I took copious notes. Then I took a two day class with Stuart after the demo. During the class he again demonstrated the "push cut" and we started practicing it. I remember Stuart walking by and hearing the sound of my cut, stopping to remind me, "put more pressure on the tool against the tool rest and lift your elbow some more." A few minutes later he came by and repeated the instruction because I still did not have it right. And I thought, yeah, I knew that. After all, I had watched him demonstrate the cut twice. And the technique was described in my copious notes and he reinforced the instruction with me just a few minutes ago! And guess what? I still needed a third reinforcement that day to do what I thought I was doing before I finally got it.

The point is; hands on instruction can be invaluable to climbing that learning curve in woodturning. Take advantage of the workshops Chattahoochee offers! Next month we have Joe Ruminski doing a workshop for us on Wednesday, June 12. The flyer is included in the newsletter so register with Ron Norris at this meeting.

DEMONSTRATION: Ever thought about adding threads to your lidded boxes, jars, or urns? Mike Peace will demonstrate the ABC's of traditional hand thread chasing techniques as he makes a box with a threaded lid. He will show how he uses various shop made ancillary tools in hand thread chasing. Mike just finished doing a couple of demonstrations on threading at the Southern States Woodturning Symposium and had an article on making a threading jig in the April issue of *American Woodturner*.

It was a wonderful experience being in a high school class with polite students who wanted to learn.

The way this came about was through Russell Massey and son Joshua whom I talked with at the last two Wood Shows.

While Russell and Joshua were at my shop for turning lessons, I found out from him that he works at the school.

He reported that they have two Jet lathes (a 1642 and a 1442) but all the tools are carbon steel junk, some bent from catches, and all dull and improperly sharpened.

The only grinder they have is a 12x2 inch industrial monster with gray stones.

The instructor is David Calloway 770-633-4298 whom I hope to spend more time with, and bring him up to speed as he has little lathe experience.

If there are any members close to Jefferson who can help, it would be greatly appreciated.

They really could use more HSS lathe tools! Please bring your *donations* to the next meeting as I expect David and Russell to be there.

Jennette and I went to **Peachtree Woodworking** and we were overwhelmed with their generosity. They supplied 5 *Stone Mountain* brand **HSS** turning tools, a Barracuda 2 chuck, a Ron Brown tool stand, and a Diamond wheel dresser.

Paul Proffitt engraved the tool handles with Jefferson City School donated by Peachtree Woodworking Supply.

Woodcraft donated an 8" low speed grinder.

Jack Morse supplied a grinder stand, Wolverine Sharpening System with a Veri-Grind attachment, diamond sharpening stones, Jacobs chuck with a #2 Morse taper, 4 Baltic Birch face plates, and a center punch made by **Mike Peace**.
