Teaching sessions are specifically designed to meet and address the student's individual needs. He served as VP for the Chattahoochee Woodturners ('98 - '00, '04 - '05) and as President of the Chattahoochee Woodturners from '00 - '02.

JULY MEETING

Demonstrator: Peggy Schmid

On Tuesday, July 12, Chattahoochee Wood Turners had the pleasure of a demo by Peggy Schmid. Peggy is a local award winning talent who is a sculptor, woodturner and artist.

For our demo, Peggy turned a hollow vessel and she demonstrated the use of some different tools to accomplish the inside hollowing. Peggy's theory on hollowing is to not spend too much time on the inside of the vessel as only other woodturners are critical of the finish of the extreme depths of the vessel.

For the outside finishing, she chose to do some surface decorating on a band around the circumference of the vessel and then applied black spray to the entire piece. She then applied a gold paste such as rub-n-buff to the decorated areas.

The finished piece looked great and Peggy is such a pleasure to watch and listen to.
