# Next Meeting: Tuesday February 12, 2008

## The President's Turn

At our January meeting **Rebekah Quattlebaum demonstrated** how a person can 'turn fruit'. She used turning a banana as her example for the evening. She took an approximate 2" X 8" roughed circular disk and removed part of the center to create a circular donut. When cut in half it would be two rough bananas. She shared examples showing how she tapered the ends and finished them by texturing & painting. We are proud of Rebekah as one of our members and how she has quickly advanced her skill over the last 2 years.

CWT Board Meeting January 22, 2008

Attendees: Dan Albertus, Hal Simmons, Jerry Chandler, John Moss, Bob Black, Paul Proffitt and myself, Theron Rogers.

#### Minutes:

- Discussion on tool rests. John Moss to look into purchasing from local tool maker. Jerry to purchase a used Sears Bandsaw for the club. \$75
- Discussion on awards. We decided to let the president coordinate awards with input from the other board members.
- Library DVD's. We set a yearly library budget of \$120. In addition any money received from rental of the DVD's to members can be used for additional purchases. Suggested that a review of 1 or 2 DVD's for each month's newsletter may draw more interest in library rentals.
- Discussion on who should be able to update the website. Resolved that the president, vice president, past president/newsletter editor, secretary and the webmaster should be able to update the website. Jerry to coordinate members accessing and updating webpage's. Paul to setup the member profiles.
- Discussion how to get members to pay dues on time. Theron to look into reminders or invoices.
- The elected Treasurer and Pres. Elect were not able to serve due to health problems. Board gave approval on the assignment of Theron to the position of Secretary and Treasure. They also approved the assignment of Wes Jones as Vice President and membership coordinator.

- Dan told us the possible AAW grant (6 mini lathes) would be announced after their board meeting Feb. 5th.
- Bob Black to contact the "students" with the plan to setup the first education class Mar 22. Basic training for members new to woodturning will also be announced.
- Publicity needed for members & other clubs for the March 11, 1-6pm "Fantasy Turnings" demonstration by Phil Colsen. \$25/member fee for this 5 hour innovative demo on woodturning. Stay for subs at 6pm and Phil's 7pm (regular meeting) demo on what can be done with a 'waste' piece of wood.
- Theron to send out a meeting reminder the day before the monthly meeting.
- Need to increase Membership through free ads in local papers and the board & members individually inviting people to our meetings. Wes & Dan will handle.
- Need to promote the Southern Symposium April 25-27 (Mike) and the National AAW Symposium in Virginia this June 20-22 (Wes). How many Chapter members belong to AAW?
- Discussed need for Newsletter contributers/writers. Dan & Paul volunteered more needed. If you have responsibilities in the Chapter and need to communicate something don't wait to be asked to write it up.
- Discussion on the Atlanta Woodworking Show. Jerry and Theron to represent our club. Hal Simmons and Wes Jones also work representing other clubs. Consider our club having a booth next year.
- John will write up additional ways to improve our monthly raffle.
- Discussion of camera "angles" and ways to improve viewing the demonstrator working at the lathe. An overhead shot does not appear to be a good idea. We might need to pull the lathe out to give the camera person better access from both sides.
